

FIND DEALING WITH A CERTAIN SET OF PARAMETERS forces me to push the creative envelope to come up with more solutions," says designer Bruce Bierman. In his Manhattan loft, he found parameters aplenty in a bathroom/dressing area with the proportions of a bowling alley.

Bierman's space-expanding bag of tricks includes mirrors, a pale palette, and meticulous organization. Both the mirrored doors to the bathroom (not shown) and the ribbed-glass pair that close off the bathing and toilet area slide into pockets between studs to conserve space. The more private area is raised a step to conceal plumbing lines, and paved in polished marble tiles. At the juncture, the floor material shifts to bleached ash. Matching ash cabinets and shelves in the vanity and dressing area maintain the muted monochromatic scheme, which is enlivened by a single bolt of color: the sandblasted glass vanity top back-painted in a luminous blue green. Against these smooth surfaces, a terrycloth

- LEVERS CAN BE OPERATED WITH WET OR SOAPY HANDS, UNLIKE DOOR KNOBS.
